ESL (English as a Second Language): Instruction for learner whose native language is not English: Learn to speak, read, and write the English language.

GED (General Education Development Diploma): Study for the national high school equivalency assessment that includes a set of 4 tests: Math, Reading/Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science.

Basic Skills Enhancement: Work on basic skills such as work-related math, functional literacy (e.g. banking skills), reading or writing assistance.

Citizenship Education: Prepare for The Naturalization Test to become a U.S. Citizen.

The Community Education Drivers Education class includes 30 hours of classroom instruction and 6 hours of behind- the- wheel training. Before taking the behind- the -wheel training the student must complete the classroom portion and pass the driver’s permit test. The classroom schedule is set and the behind –the-wheel training is set between the instructor and student. Students must take both the classroom and behind -the -wheel sessions. Attendance for all hours is mandatory.
